Active participation in research, teaching and administration in the field of comparative politics/Eastern and South-Eastern Europe (Univ.-Prof. Dr. Dorothee Bohle). This involves:

- Developing and strengthening an independent, internationally recognisable research and publication profile
- Participation in research projects
- Project applications and the acquisition of third-party funding
- Independent teaching of courses as defined by the collective bargaining agreement
- Supervision of students
- Participation in evaluation measures and quality assurance
- Participation in the department administration as well as in teaching and research administration

Profile:

- Doctoral degree (PhD or equivalent) in the field of political science or another relevant social science discipline
- Expertise in an area of comparative politics (e.g. comparative democratisation, comparative authoritarianism, comparative political economy)
- Familiarity with comparative politics research on Eastern Europe and/or South Eastern Europe
- Expertise in qualitative research methods. Expertise in multi-method research would be an advantage
- Didactic skills
- Excellent command of English, and ideally German. Knowledge of at least one East/South-East European language is an advantage. Applicants who do not know German are encouraged to develop appropriate language skills.
- Ability to work in a team
