



Public Service Deprivation and the Rise of Populism in Europe

Keynote Speech by **Prof. Catherine E. De Vries**,

Professor of Political Science, Chair of the Politics and International Relations Area, and Vice Dean of the School of Politics, Economics and Global Affairs at the IE University in Madrid

In this lecture, De Vries suggests that reduced access to essential public services — public service deprivation — helps to explain why certain regions become strongholds of far-right and populist support. Drawing on evidence from multiple European countries, she shows that areas affected by long-term disinvestment in public services and infrastructure are more prone to political discontent and radical voting behavior. She argues that this pattern is driven by the interplay of demand- and supply-side dynamics: citizens adopt zero-sum perceptions of resource competition, while far-right parties strategically frame service decline as the result of immigration and elite neglect. De Vries highlights the role of emotional rhetoric in this process.





Main Building Plan

Floors KO2-D, KOL-E, KOL-F




Main Building Plan

From Main Building






DIRECTIONS
